RMS PTSA Drama Covid Safety Protocol

The following procedures will be implemented to ensure the safety of the participants in the RMS PTSA Drama production:

- 1. All participants, youth and adults, will be wearing masks at all times and will remain home if they are not feeling well.
- 2. Before entering rehearsal, a parent volunteer will show the following information to each student and asked if any of it applies to them. If they answer yes to any question, they may need to stay home but must speak with Danielle or Cindy about the next steps to attending rehearsal safely.

1. In the last 24 hours, have you experienced any of the following symptoms?

- Fever of 100.4 or above
- Cough
- Shortness of Breath or Difficulty Breathing
- Chills
- Loss of Taste or Smell
- Fatigue
- Muscle Pain or Body Aches
- Headache
- Sore Throat
- Congestion or Runny Nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Other signs of new illness

2. Are any of the following true?

- Have you been in close contact with anyone with confirmed COVID-19? Close contact includes; been within 6 feet of a person with COVID 19 for a combined total of 15 mins or more within a 24 hour period; *OR* live in the same household as a person with COVID-19; *OR* cared for a person with COVID-19; *OR* been in direct contact with saliva or other body secretions from a person with COVID-19.
- 2. Have you or anyone in your household had a positive COVID-19 test for active virus in the past 10 days?
- 3. Within the past 14 days, has a public health or medical professional told you to self-monitor, self-isolate, or self-quarantine because of concerns about COVID-19?

If you answered YES to any of the above, please do not go to rehearsal and call Cindy at 425-457-0111 or Danielle 510-363-5515 to discuss when it's safe to return to rehearsal.

- 3. If you exhibit symptoms before or during rehearsal, you will be removed from the group and your parent will be called and you will need to be taken home.
 - a. The same policies for returning to school with symptoms will be followed for returning to rehearsal. (see attached document)
 - b. We ask that you contact the school nurse the following day and she will guide you through the process for returning to school.
 - c. Once you are cleared to return to school, you may also return to rehearsal.
- 4. If you are a close contact of someone who tests positive for covid

- d. you may continue to attend rehearsal if you are vaccinated but we ask that you get tested at 3-7 days after the exposure
- e. If you are not vaccinated we ask that you quarantine for 7 days and get a negative test before returning to rehearsal
- 5. Similar to what you've seen done at school, the drama chairs will e-mail all participants of the cast and crew notifying you if someone involved in the show test positive for covid. If you are deemed a close contact, (was at rehearsal with the positive person within 3 days before they tested positive), you will receive a separate e-mail notifying you of the potential exposure and the steps you need to take.
